LEARNED THE IMPORTANCE OF helping others very early in life. My parents were always involved in our community and volunteered their time to several important causes. I knew I wanted to follow in their footsteps.

Those childhood lessons led to me to a career in nursing which fulfilled my desire to help others. But after fifteen years, I was ready to help people in a new way. I embarked on a new career in social work; this was my true calling.

As a social worker in our Victoria hospitals, I have seen countless instances where people were thrown into situations beyond their control. Social workers are intuitive listeners; we're often meeting people who have just experienced a traumatic life event. We're a shoulder to cry on but also there to help with everything from government support programs to funeral planning. I have often described it as the emotional side of medicine.

This year, I have spent a lot of time thinking about the legacy I want to leave. In January, I lost my husband, Dennis, after 49 years of marriage. He spent his final days at RJH, where he received excellent care. In December, I'll retire after 25 years, many of which were spent working at RJH and VGH.

My husband was extremely generous which is part of the reason why I decided to include the Foundation in my estate. I want to ensure the legacy of giving we started together, continues. I know Dennis would be proud of my decision—one that will leave behind glimmers of hope and positivity."

## RESEARCH: CARDIAC STUDY COMES TO VICTORIA

In a preventative research project for cardiac care, thanks to a generous commitment of \$320,000 from Al and Eileen Gilchrist.

Joining Kelowna General Hospital, Royal Columbian Hospital, St. Paul's Hospital, and Vancouver General Hospital, RJH will host SAVE BC, Study to Avoid cardioVascular Events in British Columbia, designed to help patients, families, and healthcare professionals better identify, treat, and prevent premature atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease.

The Gilchrists met with the first SAVE BC patient in Victoria, 42-year-old Carlos Gomez, who had early onset heart attack symptoms in 2021, and required cardiac care at RJH. Carlos has a family history of high cholesterol disease.

"Knowledge is power and comfort. It is important for me, and for my two children, to understand why I developed cardiac care issues before my fortieth birthday," shares Carlos. "My hope is that by working with Dr. Franco I can support my children and their friends in the future, before they even face cardiac issues."

#### **EQUIPMENT: NEW IMAGING MACHINES ARE OPERATIONAL**

ONORS TO IMAGING IS POWER can be proud: three new imaging machines are now operational in our hospitals thanks to their support.

The first of three MRI refurbishment projects is now complete: a milestone to celebrate in our hospitals and across the country, as the MRI was refurbished using a first-in-Canada technique. Over 200 MRI scans of the knee were performed during the first weekend of operation.

A brand-new CT scanner is also now installed at VGH. 15,000 scans will be performed on the new CT every single year—what an imprint our donors will have on patient journeys.

In RJH's Heart Catheterization
Laboratory, a new C-Arm has been
installed—the most vital piece of equipment
for our interventional cardiologists. The
new machine provides exceptional image
quality more efficiently and reduces the
number of procedures required.

Donors will continue to make an impact as three other donor-funded imaging tools will be operationalized in 2025. With imaging being a catalyst in many surgical patients' journeys, we are excited to parallel the momentum of *Imaging is Power* as we embark on *It's Time for Surgical Innovation*.
